- 2) Unhappy conclusions versus unhappy chapters

    - i) Give some examples of unhappy conclusions in the Bible:
      - (1) Judas – Matthew 27:5
      - (2) Ananias – Acts 5:5
      - (3) Final destruction of the wicked – Rev. 20:9

    - ii) Give some examples of unhappy chapters that are not the end of the story:

- (1) John the Baptist – Matthew 14:10-12 (John 11:23-25)
  - (2) Stephen – Acts 7:59-60 (John 10:27-28)
  - (3) Jesus – Luke 23:52-Luke 24:6 (Rev. 1:18)
  - (4) Other examples?
