

1. Michael, our Prince

- a) Daniel 12:1a Who is Michael, the great Prince? (we may find a clue in Daniel 9:25)
- b) What does the name Michael mean?
- c) Jude 9 The title archangel is only used in reference to Michael (see Deuteronomy 34:5-6)
- d) Revelation 12:7 Michael leads the heavenly angelic host in the cosmic battle (Matthew 26:53)
- e) What is the significance of Michael standing up? See also Daniel 7:13-14.
- f) The eternal Son of God, Son of Man, as Leader of the heavenly angelic host, is referred to as Michael.

2. Those whose names are written in the book

- a) Daniel 12:1 What book is Daniel referring to?
- b) Revelation 20:12,15 – the Book of Life
- c) Revelation 13:8, 21:27 – the Lamb’s Book of Life
- d) Crucial question: How can our names be written in the Lamb’s Book of Life? (See Romans 10:9,13, 1 John 5:13)

3. A time of trouble

- a) Daniel 12:1 – such as never was
- b) Psalm 27:4-5 – a precious promise
- c) Some people are fearful about a time of trouble such as never was. How we find freedom from that fear?

4. A resurrection of the dead

- a) Daniel 12:2 – the sleep of death (see John 11:11-14)
- b) John 5:25,28-29 – the teaching of Jesus about resurrection
- c) 1 Thessalonians 4:13-16 – the timing of the resurrection of the righteous
- d) Share some Bible promises that give us assurance we can find freedom from the fear of death. Psalm 23:4, Hebrews 2:14-15, Revelation 1:17-18, etc.

5. Seal up the book

- a) Daniel 12:4,9 Why is Daniel commanded to seal up the book until the time of the end?
- b) What is the difference between the end of time and the time of the end?
- c) When were the prophecies of Daniel unsealed?

6. A closing revelation

- a) Daniel 12:5-13
 - i) 1260 days - a time, times, and half a time
 - (1) Daniel 7:25, Revelation 11:3, 12:6,14
 - ii) 1290 days – v.11
 - iii) 1335 days – v.12
- b) What comfort do we find in the words of Jesus recorded in John 16:4? (see also 1 Cor. 13:12)
- c) What is the most important lesson you have learned from your study of the Book of Daniel?
